	Chairman Van Wingerden called the regular meeting of the Carpinteria Groundwater Sustainability Agency Board of Directors held in the Carpinteria City Hall Chamber to order at 5:32 p.m., Wednesday, March 13, 2024.

PUBLIC FORUM	No one from the public addressed the Board.			
MINUTES	Following discussion, Director Johnson moved, and Director Holcombe seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the Board meeting held on February 28, 2024. The motion carried by a 3-1-1 vote with Director Roberts abstaining and Director Balch absent. The minutes were approved by roll call as follows; Ayes: Holcombe, Johnson and Van Wingerden Nayes: none Abstain: Roberts Absent: Balch			
ENGAGEMENT OF DCSE	Executive Director McDonald presented to consider engaging the services of DCSE for GIS services with respect to estimating private groundwater extraction in an amount not to exceed \$20,000. DCSE Proposal: - DCSE has developed an approach to estimate crop water use by measuring the evapotranspiration (ET) from satellite imagery once a week. - This is helpful to the GSA in determining if its approach for estimating is off, based on a completely separate method.			

	 The water demands for a plant may be different depending on direction of slope face, sun exposure, fog, time of year and density of canopy. The ET method is not meant to replace the current method of irrigation rates for specific crops or the use of well meters, it is a way to consider other information. Carolyn Frary addressed the Board with concerns of why meters are not required, the cost to install them and paying for groundwater that growers are not using. How does satellite ET estimates take into account for greenhouses? Are greenhouses required to install meters if using wells? Concern is the unknown cost of implementation.
	Executive Director gave a verbal response.
	Following discussion, Director Holcombe moved, and Director Johnson seconded the motion to authorize the Executive Director to engage DCSE's services for FY 22 in an amount not to exceed \$20,000. The motion carried by a 4-0-1 vote with Director Balch absent. The motion was approved by roll call as follows;

JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY AGREEMENT	Executive Director McDonald presented to consider revising the Joint Powers Authority Agreement for the GSA.
	 Example of changes: Supermajority to simple majority Clarifying Unanimous vote as all Directors in attendance rather than All Directors on the Board, etc. Item changed to Information Only as all 5 Directors needed to be present to vote. Will be brought back at future meeting.
ADJOURNMENT	Director Van Wingerden requested a plan for private pumpers that will install meters and possible recharge credits.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

To Property Owners of Real Property About Proposed Groundwater Sustainability Agency Fees

When: Wednesday, June 12, 2024 @ 5:35 pm

Where: Carpinteria City Hall, 5775 Carpinteria Ave, Carpinteria, CA 93013

The Board of Directors of the Carpinteria Groundwater Sustainability Agency (CGSA) will hold a **Public Hearing** on Wednesday, June 12, 2024, at 5:35 p.m. to consider changes to GSA fees for fiscal years 2025 and 2026. The CGSA determines the GSA pumping fee using methods outlined in the 2024 CGSA Fee Study which is incorporated into this notice by reference and can be found on the CGSA website at https://carpgsa.org/.

If you are a **legal property owner** subject to the fee and you oppose the **GSA fee changes** (as shown in Table I below) please submit one protest for your parcel in accordance with the requirements below:

- (1) the assessor's parcel number(s) or street address(es) of the identified parcel(s); and
- (2) the printed name *and* original signature of the property owner of record.

At the Public Hearing, the CGSA Board will accept oral and written testimony, as well as written protests, regarding the proposed fee. Written testimony, including protests, will also be accepted at 1301 Santa Ynez Avenue, Carpinteria, CA 93013. All mailed protests must be received by June 12, 2024, by 5:00 pm. Written protests submitted during the Public Hearing must be received by the Executive Director before the hearing concludes.

The GSA fee supports the sustainability of the Carpinteria Groundwater Basin. The fee is based on estimated pumping for parcels using groundwater. Charges were developed using crop-based estimates for each parcel. Estimates were sent out to each parcel in early 2024 for verification.

If valid protests against the proposed fee are presented by a majority of property owners of identified parcels served by the CGSA, the CGSA shall not impose the fee change. Please call me, Bob McDonald, Executive Director, at 805-263-4826 if you have any questions about the Public Hearing process or the proposed changes to GSA fees. California law (Government Code section 53759) provides a 120-day statute of limitations for judicially challenging these rates.
